Communicative Expectations

- Identifying the topic and some isolated facts from simple sentences in informational texts and in short fictional texts.
- Understanding familiar questions and simple sentences in conversations.
- Requesting and providing information by asking and answering some practiced and some original questions on familiar and everyday topics, using simple sentences most of the time.
- Interacting with others to meet basic needs related to routine everyday activities, using simple sentences and questions most of the time.
- Expressing, asking about, and reacting to preferences, feelings or opinions on familiar topics, using simple sentences most of the time and asking questions to keep the conversation on topic.
- Presenting personal information about your life and activities, using simple sentences most of the time.
- Presenting preferences on familiar and everyday topics of interest, using simple sentences most of the time.
- Informing others by presenting on familiar and everyday topics, using simple sentences most of the time.
