- SMR offers a tradition of academic success. Over \$22 million in scholarships were awarded to the 167 graduates in the SMR Class of 2021! On average, the Class of 2021 earned \$131,700 per graduate in scholarships. In comparison, graduates from Calvert, Charles, and St. Mary's County earned \$48,500.
- Our goal is to help your student get into the college of their choice with scholarships. Our highly professional school counselors provide college preparation services starting freshman year and continuing through graduation.
- All students are offered numerous leadership and extracurricular opportunities through clubs, volunteering and positions within their athletic teams and fine arts groups.
- As a member of the highly competitive Washington Catholic Athletic Conference, we offer a well-rounded athletic program with 17 varsity sports. Annually, we celebrate championship-winning teams and student-athletes who commit to four-year universities to continue playing their sport.
- Our teaching environment and college-like campus promote self-discipline, and we instill high expectations for proper behavior on and off campus.
- A dynamic sense of family and community has become our hallmark. The St. Mary's Ryken community reaches beyond the high school years with students, alumni, athletic teams and faculty maintaining connections for years. This includes a solid alumni network that leads students to professional opportunities and strong friendships beyond high school.
- On-campus technology includes a 1:1 iPad program, and Project Lead the Way biomedical, computer science (focus on cybersecurity) and engineering (focus on aerospace) courses that lead to internships with local industry experts.



OUR 87-ACRE, WATERFRONT CAMPUS offers a high school experience like no other in the Southern Maryland area. Our college-like campus prepares students for life after high school. Each day, students attend classes in six different buildings on campus, allowing them plenty of time outdoors.

Donnie Williams Center

The auditorium is used for fine arts events, theatre productions, student assemblies and parent meetings.



Strength and Conditioning Room, Donnie Williams Center

SCHEDULE

Each semester students take seven classes. They attend four classes per day with a study hall and X-hour. Classes rotate daily.

X-Hour stands for Xaverian Hour, and is the time of day when students get extra help from their teachers, participate in clubs, or meet with their faculty adviser. X-hour enables all students to participate in extracurricular activities and seek help from faculty during the school day, no matter what they have scheduled after school.

CLUBS

Students have many opportunities to join and lead clubs every year. Clubs include Astronomy, Drone, Envirothon, Interact, Mock Trial, Model United Nations, National Honor Society, Poetry, Robotics, Stage Guild, Student Council and many more!

TRANSPORTATION

Free bus transportation for St. Mary's County students is provided by the St. Mary's County Government Non-Public School Transportation Division. For students from Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles and Prince George's counties, transportation is available for a fee.

A late bus (activity bus) is available for students who reside outside of St. Mary's County. It departs the St. Mary's Ryken campus at 5:30 p.m. every school day when athletic practices or activities are occurring.
